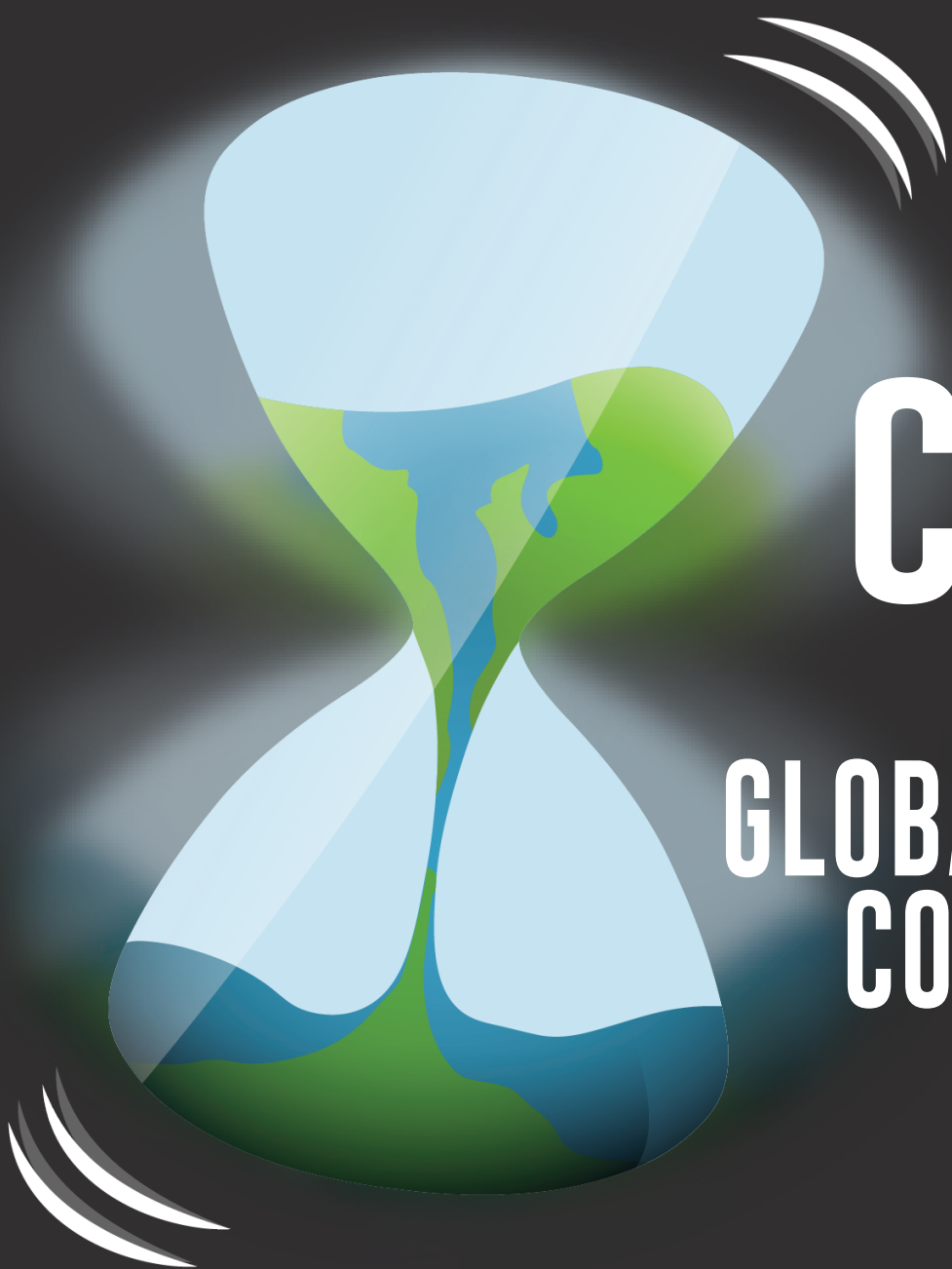


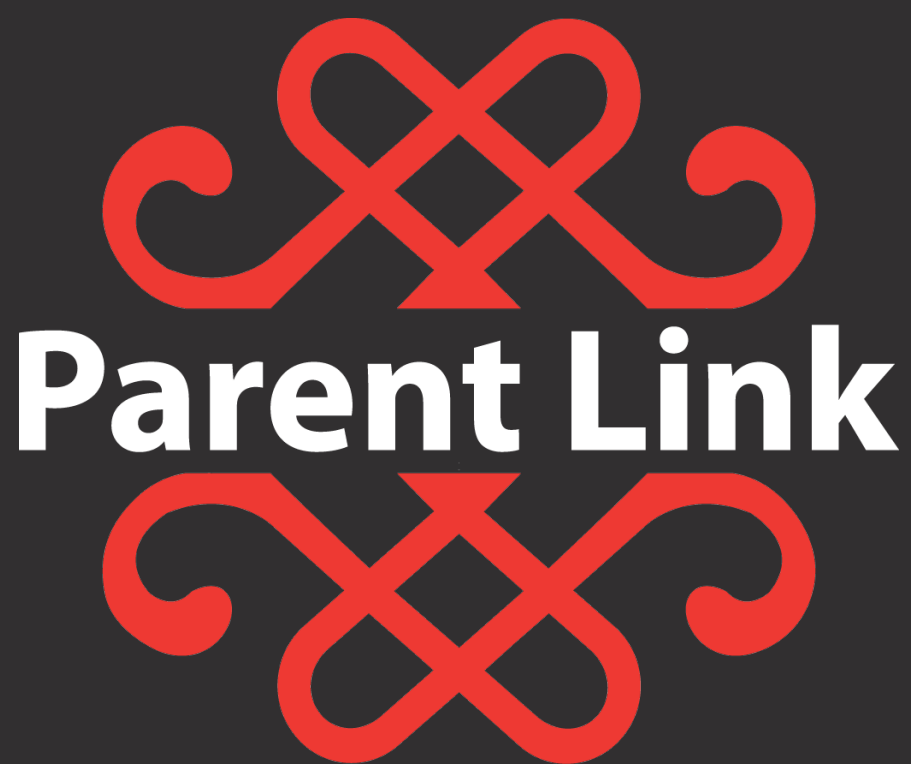

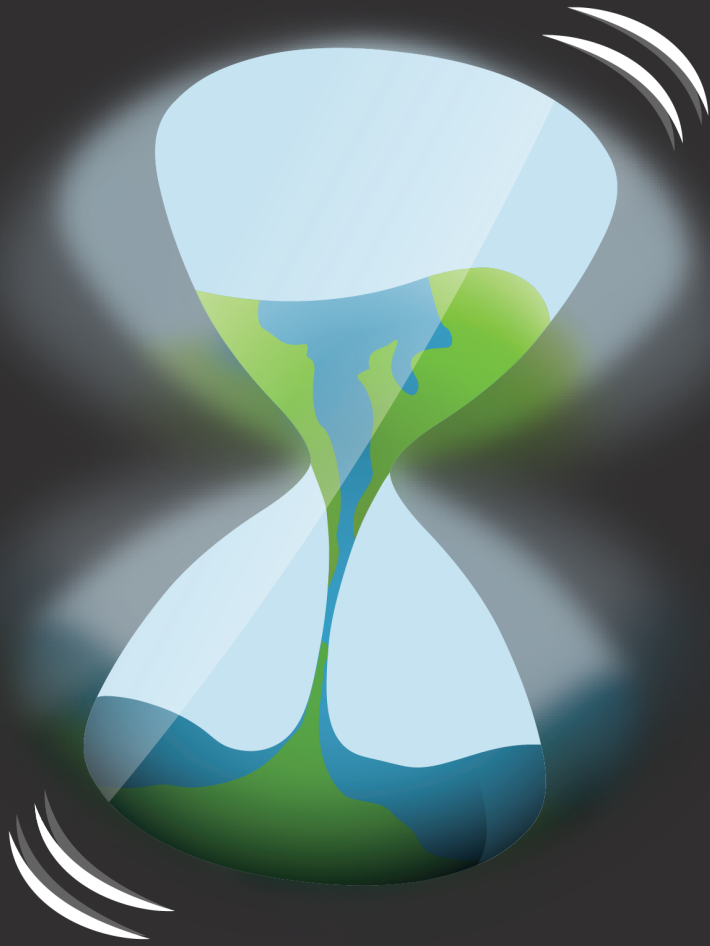
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SHAKE UP CALL.

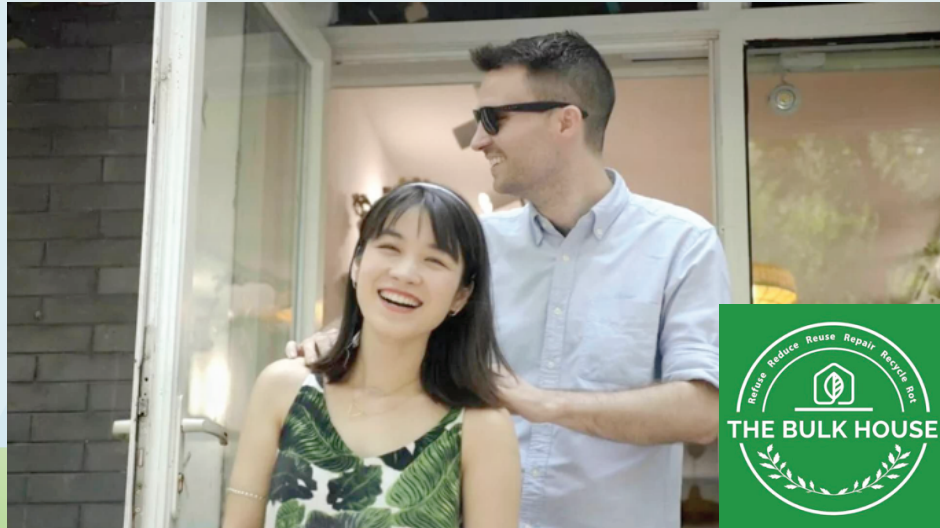

He began with grassroots fundraising to help people living in the shanty-towns of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil and slowly scaled up his efforts to deliver humanitarian assistance to people around the world. He has assisted people and projects across the Americas, Asia and Africa with his model of "micro-philanthropy" – researching the issue, searching for reliable local partners and delivering immediate, hands-on assistance to the people in need. Adam has been living and working around the world for 22 years. He is currently teaching 8th grade at WAB.
